

RECYCLE RIGHT TIPS

- Do not bag your recyclables. Place materials loosely/directly into carts.
- Never put foods or liquids in recycling.
- Break down cardboard boxes to conserve space inside recycling carts and ensure the cart lid is firmly closed.
- Items not accepted in recycling include plastic bags or film, foam cups/containers/packaging, yard waste, electronics, carpeting, clothing, furniture, tires or hazardous materials in recycling carts.
- Glass is not accepted in recycling.
