## MAYOR'S MESSAGE

One of the greatest privileges of serving as your mayor is the opportunity to represent our city at meaningful events throughout our region. Last month, I had the honor of attending two impactful events in one day, both reminding me of the deep sense of purpose and connection that comes with public service.

The day began with the ribbon-cutting ceremony for the new Children's Justice Center (CJC), a place where children who are victims or witnesses of crimes can be interviewed in a safe, child-friendly environment. This center provides a compassionate and private setting, far removed from the often-intimidating atmosphere of police stations or courtrooms.

I was proud to attend alongside the Police Chief, our City Administrator, two of our officers, and our dedicated Victims' Advocate. We were joined by many local and state leaders, as well as two brave women who shared how an earlier version of the CJC changed their lives back in the 1990s. Their powerful stories were a testament to the importance of community-supported services like the CJC, and a reminder that healing is possible when we create spaces filled with care.

Later that evening, I attended Bravo Night, an event hosted by the United Way of Northern Utah and held at the stunning Northrop Grumman facility in Ogden Canyon. This evening was all about celebrating extraordinary contributions across Northern Utah—from individual volunteers to corporate and community partners making a lasting impact.

Awards were presented to partners including the Corporate Partner of the Year, Community Partner of the Year, and Weber County, who was honored as the Partner for Success. It was a beautiful celebration of unity, generosity, and shared goals. I was grateful for the opportunity to represent Harrisville at such a distinguished and inspiring event.

These experiences remind me once again of how important it is to have strong partnerships between communities, nonprofits, law enforcement, and local government. Being part of these moments is both humbling and energizing. Harrisville may be a small city, but we




