## MAYOR'S MESSAGE

You may have noticed that behind the Ascension Lutheran Church at 1100 North and Washington Boulevard, an important project is taking shape that will make a real difference for families in our community. The new Family Promise building broke ground in December of 2024, and we look forward to its planned dedication on Tuesday, October 28, 2025.

Family Promise is unlike a traditional shelter. While it does provide essential needs such as food and temporary housing, it also focuses on helping families build lasting independence. Many of the families served are parents with young children, often under the age of six, who are facing the first stages of homelessness. The program steps in early to provide stability while also teaching valuable skills, offering guidance, and breaking down barriers that prevent families from returning to self-sufficiency.

At its heart, Family Promise is about more than providing shelter, it is about restoring hope and helping people get back on their feet. With the rising cost of living, more families have found themselves struggling to maintain stable housing. Yet, the program has many success stories of families who have moved from the streets into secure housing, thanks to the support, mentoring, and care they received.

Harrisville has been recognized by Family Promise for being a welcoming community; one that has embraced this project without stigma and with open hearts. This is something we can all be proud of.

I encourage those who have the time, resources, or interest to learn more about Family Promise. There are many ways to contribute, whether through volunteering, donations, or simply sharing their mission with others. Together, we can help ensure that families facing hardship have the tools and support they need to move toward brighter futures.

As always, I appreciate the opportunity to serve our community as mayor.
