The new city building is well underway, and I will continue to follow the construction process closely. My goal is to manage costs responsibly while ensuring we provide the city with a quality facility that will serve our community for many years to come.

During our first City Council meeting, we moved the public comment period to the beginning of the meeting. From my perspective, this was a positive change, and I hope those who shared comments felt valued and heard. We also established a Community Activities Committee, which will be led by Jason Hadley. We are currently working on the budget for the upcoming year. I am committed to controlling spending while ensuring that we continue to fund projects that provide safety and value for our citizens.
