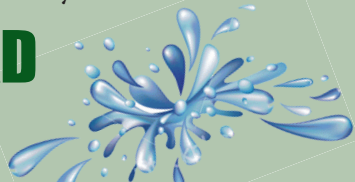

What may seem like small acts of kindness have created a tremendous positive impact throughout our neighborhood and beyond. Their efforts have inspired connections, friendships, and a stronger sense of belonging not only on our street, but in other neighborhoods throughout our city as well.

I know this "one neighbor" has made a meaningful difference in my own life and in the lives of my family, including my children and grandchildren. They have also inspired me to try to become a better neighbor myself. Like many of us, I still have room to improve, but their example reminds me how much influence one person can have through simple acts of kindness and inclusion.

Their example also reminds me of a story about a couple living in a close-knit neighborhood. Each day, the wife would complain about how dirty the neighbor's laundry looked hanging outside. Then one day she noticed how clean and bright the laundry appeared and commented on how much better it looked. Her husband quietly replied that perhaps the laundry looked cleaner because he had cleaned their window.

There is an important lesson in that story. Before judging others, we should first take time to reflect on ourselves and perhaps "clean our own window."

I hope each of you have a wonderful June filled with family, friendship, and community. I encourage all of us to strive to be "the one good neighbor" who makes a positive difference in the lives of others and helps strengthen the spirit of community that makes our city such a special place to call home.
